## A report on 32<sup>nd</sup> Indian Association of Sedimentologists Annual Meeting

32<sup>nd</sup> Indian Association of Sedimentologists Annual Meeting and International Conference on "Geosciences and Environment" was held in Annamalai University during 7-10 January, 2016. The meeting was co-sponsored by Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India, Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, Government of India, Oil and Natural Gas Commission, RAMCO Cements and Society for Sedimentary Geology (SEPM).

A total of 178 abstracts were presented during the meeting which was followed by a field trip on the day four. Abstracts pertain to following eighteen themes.

- T-14 Natural and man-made hazards and management
- T-15 Earth resources and management
- T-16 Lakes, Rivers and Wetland management
- T-17 Medical Geology and geological impact on environment
- T-18 Geo-heritage and Tourism management

The Association decided to convene the 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting in Varanasi, the dates of which are yet to be decided.
